

DIY Halloween Costume Guide







## **Estimated cost \$30 or less**

Adult costume garments:
Adult Eversoft® Crew Sweatshirt (black)

Kid costume garments: ] Boys' Heather Fleece Raglan Crew Sweatshirt (charcoal)

Costume supplies:

#### Items you need but may have already:

- Cardboard
- White color pencil
- Pencil sharpener
- Glue stick
- Poster board
- ☐ Masking tape
- Criscore
- Scissors

#### **Optional:**

- Protective glove (for precision cutting tool)
- Precision cutting tool
- ] Adult Eversoft<sup>®</sup> Sweatpants (black)
- Boys' Fleece Elastic Bottom Sweatpants (charcoal)



#### 1. Preparing your template

Print the template on four 8.5"x11" pages and trim on dotted lines.

Tape the template at the seams so the design lines up.

For a sturdier template, we recommend gluing the template to poster board and cutting with a precision cutting tool prior to transferring to the sweatshirt.



2. Transferring onto your sweatshirt

Once cut out, place the template on the sweatshirt and align web around neck hole.

Then tape the template to the sweatshirt once you have the best placement.

Use a white color pencil to outline the web design.

Once you can easily see the outline, remove the template and get ready to paint!

#### 3. Time to paint

Place a scrap piece of cardboard inside the sweatshirt. It's best to place the sweatshirt in a position where the sleeves are horizontal to your body so you can work in a manner that will prevent paint smudging.

We recommend beginning at farthest point from your body and begin by outlining the design in paint and then filling in the space between those lines. Continue in this manner until you fill the entire design working from top to bottom.



### 4. Let dry

Let the design dry for four hours.

If you'd like to apply another coat of paint, this is the time. If not, get ready to trick-or-treat!

Tip: We applied three coats of paint for best results.
